FY18-19 Proposed Budget Now Online

City Manager John Ogburn and Finance Director Debbie Reaves have presented the proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2018-2019. The proposed budget does not include any increases to water and sewer rates or the property tax rate and includes a combined water and sewer fund and general fund allocation of \$42.8 million.

Some highlights of the proposed budget include funding to extend sanitary sewer service eastward on US Highway 64, money to complete renovations at the new Recreation Center, investments in Information Technology to upgrade computers and network security, and a 2.5% cost of living adjustment.

The City Council will hold a public hearing on the proposed budget at its June 7th Council meeting and is expected to consider adoption of the budget at a public meeting on June 26th. The proposed budget is available online at: <https://bit.ly/2xNdA3T>
