The Asheboro City Council met with the Midtown Committee of the Asheboro/Randolph Chamber of Commerce, the Asheboro Redevelopment Commission and the Asheboro Community Appearance Commission at 6:00 PM on Thursday, May 29, 2003, in the conference room at the Asheboro/Randolph Chamber of Commerce building located at 317 East Dixie Drive, Asheboro, North Carolina.

The following city officials and staff were present: Mayor David Jarrell, Council Members Talmadge Baker, Linda Carter, Nancy Hunter, John McGlohon, Archie "Mack" Priest, and David Smith. Council Member Paul Trollinger was absent. Also present were City Manager John Ogburn; City Attorney Jeff Sugg; City Engineer Dumont Bunker; and Community Development Director Lynn Priest.
